What Are Double Negatives?

A **double negative** results when one uses more than one negative word or construction to express a single negative thought.

Double negatives are used in English to make a very positive statement, but this is not appropriate for a scientific paper. In addition, in Japanese, a double negative can actually strengthen the negativeness of a statement. However, its translation into English becomes quite difficult and confusing for the reader.

Remember, too, that words such as hardly, barely, and scarcely are negative in effect.

Example 1

Incorrect: The coach was unable to offer no reasons for his team's behavior. **Correct:** The coach was unable to offer any reasons for his team's behavior.

Example 2

Incorrect: In fact, he was hardly able to say nothing at all. **Correct:** In fact, he was hardly able to say anything at all.

Example 3

Incorrect: No background staining was not seen.

Correct: Background staining was not seen.

Also Correct: No background staining was seen.
